

CANDIDATES SELECTED FOR MAYVILLE CHIEF OF POLICE

The Mayville Chief of Police Advisory Committee has selected five candidates to be interviewed for the position of Mayville Chief of Police. The five were chosen from twenty-one applicants. The interviews will be conducted on April 9 at the Mayville Fire Hall beginning at 8:00 a.m.. The public is welcome to attend.

After the interviews the Committee will give to the Village Manager their individual recommendations. From that point the Manager will select the top candidate to hold economic negotiations with for an employment agreement. The Village Council will then take action on the economic package recommended by the Manager.

The candidates to be interviewed are as follows:

David M Forystek, 22 years in law enforcement, most recent placement is with the City of Flint where he is a Sergeant. He is also an instructor at the Flint Police Academy. He is completing his Criminal Justice degree at Mott Community College. He currently resides in Clio.

Michael Pousak, 25 years in law enforcement, most recent placement is with the City of Oak Park Public Safety where he is a Lieutenant. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Wayne State University and a Masters of Public Administration from Oakland University. He currently resides in Rochester Hills.

James Carlson, 27 years in law enforcement, most recent placement is with the City of Owosso where he is a Sergeant. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice from Michigan State University. He is currently enrolled in the Masters of Administrative Services at Saginaw Valley State University. He currently resides in Flushing.

Richard Zavislak, 26 years in law enforcement, most recent placement is as the Chief of Police for Capac. He completed the Northwestern University Center for Public Safety School for Police Staff and Command. He currently resides in Washington Michigan.

Adam Green, 4 years in law enforcement, most recently with the Mayville Police Department as Interim Chief. He holds an Associate Degree in Applied Science in Criminal Justice from Mott Community College. He currently resides in Columbiaville.

It is expected the new Chief of Police will begin duties by the middle of May.
